

Off with Her Head!



These activities are for you to do at home. You can do all of them or choose the ones that you find most interesting.

Activities

1. Create a project glossary by writing a definition for each of the words listed. Use a dictionary to help. Add any other terms that you learn while completing the other home learning activities.

- annulment
- behead
- dynasty
- excommunicate
- heir
- succession
- treason
- trial

2. Use a range of sources to research the House of Tudor and the five Tudor monarchs. Record your findings by writing a list of facts. Then, write a short paragraph about Henry VII, Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I and Elizabeth I.
3. Find out why Thomas Cromwell, Francis Drake and Anne Boleyn were key figures during Tudor times. Record your findings in a table to explain their role and importance.
4. Use a range of sources to find out about key events from the House of Tudor's rule. Create a timeline to record the events and dates on which they happened. Include a few sentences on your timeline to explain each event. Two examples of events that you could include are:
 - 1485 – Henry Tudor established the House of Tudor on the 22nd August. He defeated Richard III on the battlefield at Bosworth and became Henry VII.
 - 1603 – On the 24th March, Elizabeth I died without an heir. The King of Scotland, James VI, Elizabeth I's cousin, became James I of England. This event marked the end of the House of Tudor and the beginning of a new dynasty, the Stuarts.



5. Find out more about Henry VIII to answer the enquiry question, 'Who was Henry VIII and how did he live his life?' Research areas include:

- the number of times that he was married and what happened to his wives
- his homes and lifestyle
- his hobbies and what he was like as a person
- why having a son was important to him
- why the pope excommunicated him
- his achievements

Afterwards, share your findings with an adult, and together, discuss and answer the enquiry question.

6. Find out more about Anne Boleyn, Henry VIII's second wife, to answer the enquiry question, 'Who was Anne Boleyn and was she treated fairly?' Research areas include:

- how she met Henry VIII
- why Henry VIII could not marry her immediately, and his actions because of this
- when she was the Queen of England
- why Henry VIII wanted to divorce her, and his reasons for executing her
- her trial and death

Afterwards, share your findings with an adult, and together, discuss and answer the enquiry question.

7. Use your research skills to find out about Elizabeth I and write a short biography of her life. Include a description of her character, events that happened during her lifetime, and provide your opinion on whether she was a good monarch.

8. Choose an important event from Tudor times and write a newspaper report about it. Imagine that you are reporting about the event after it happened. Examples of events include Anne Boleyn's beheading, Henry VIII's marriages, Edward VI's birth or Elizabeth I's death. Include a snappy headline, byline, date, orientation paragraph and relevant facts.



9. Portraits of monarchs give messages about their power, status and personality and do not always show what the monarch looked like in real life. Look online at a range of portraits, then create a portrait of a Tudor monarch or other important Tudor figure. Think about how you can show their power, status or personality, using colour, expression, poses, clothing, and background objects or setting.
