# Do you currently claim Free School Meals for your child or are you unsure if you qualify - please see below for details of eligibility. If you received the benefits mentioned below and you claim for FSM you may be entitled to Pupil Premium funding to support your child's education.

#### Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2

All Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the **Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)** initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed below, your school may be entitled to claim **Pupil Premium** funding to support your child's education. Please apply using the application form below.

#### Children in Year 3 and above

Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you, or the child themselves in their own right, receives of any of the following benefits:

- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support
- Universal Credit Your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are **NOT** eligible for free school meals, regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed

- Working Tax Credit
- Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance

However, you will be temporarily eligible to claim free school meals if you receive a **Working Tax Credit run-on**, which is the payment you may receive for a further four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.


