# Your School Nurse

Your child can have access to a School Nurse at any time if you have any health concerns, in addition your School Nurse offers a full health assessment in reception and year 6.

## The School Nurse can check:

- Your child is growing healthily and support with healthy eating
- Support with access to dental care and general support for dental hygiene
- Help with day / night time wetting or soiling
- Provide information about immunisations
- Guidance re healthy lifestyles
- Support with general hygiene issues including head lice and worms
- Support with general emotional health issues
- Support to access other health professionals
- Routines, including sleep

## Additionally in Year 6:

- Friendships
- Relationships
- Development, including periods and puberty
- Access to specialist services – including dietician, healthy weight programmes and voluntary services
- Developmental issues
- Transition to secondary school
- Healthy lifestyles

## Grampound PFA - Bags2School

As part of our fundraising this term Grampound with Creed PFA have joined the Bags2School scheme. For those who have not heard of the scheme they collect good quality second hand clothes and bedding and we get sum of money depending upon how much is donated. Unlike previous year they ask that clothing donations are given in a good quality black bin bag. If the bag splits and the clothes get wet or dirty then they will not be able to accept them. The collection date will be 25th November in the morning so you have plenty of time for a clear out. Below is a flyer with the details of what donations are accepted.

- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material
